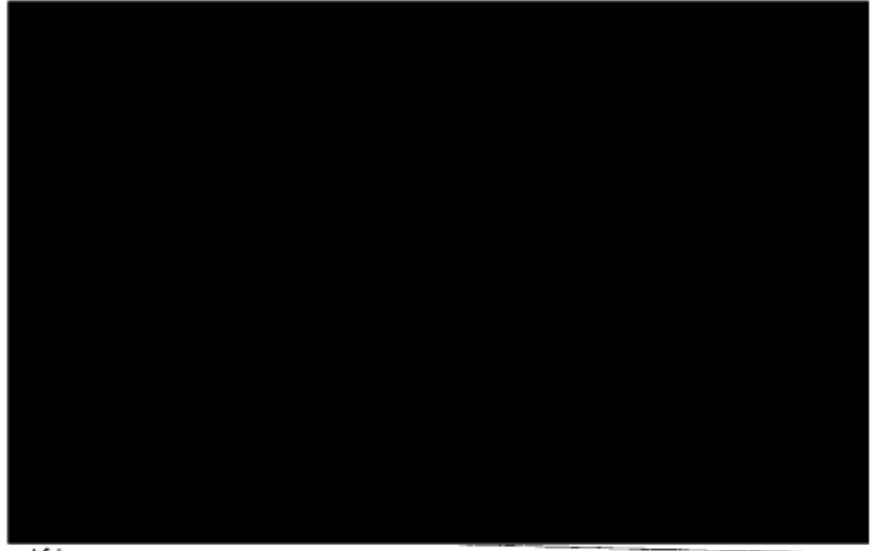

## Rwanda:

**Rebels Advancing**

The Rwandan Patriotic Front is publicly claiming victories in the north and near Kigali. The rebels now have 4,000 troops and plan to seize the airport from the remaining Ghanaian UN guards.

The RPF will be represented at peace talks in Tanzania, but recent rebel broadcasts indicate that they still refuse to negotiate with the Hutu interim government.

— They may be willing to meet with military officers and political party leaders, however, in an effort to stop the genocide, which relief workers say is spreading south.

— *The RPF probably hopes it can persuade officers and moderate Hutu politicians to support an RPF-dominated coalition government.*
